Please accept this letter as notice of the State's intention to provide informational state aid notices to all school districts consistent with the School Funding Reform Act, N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-34 et seq. (SFRA).

David Hespe, 1 Acting Commissioner, 2014, On April Budget Education, informed the Senate Department of Appropriations Committee that additional funding information will be provided to all school districts and to the Legislature The information will assist the in the next several weeks. districts in better understanding their proposed Fiscal Year 2015 State aid against the backdrop of the SFRA. Specifically, the Department will provide expanded State aid notices that include the same content and information as the State aid notices for FY2014 and FY2013. This includes the district's adequacy budget and the maximum amount of aid payable to the N.J.S.A. 18A:7F-5. Commissioner Hespe district under the SFRA. expects the notices to be issued on or about April 28, 2014.

This information is responsive to the Education Law Center's (ELC) March 27, 2014, motion in the above-captioned matter, as well as independent inquiries of school districts.

Additionally, as indicated by the Commissioner at the budget hearing, the Department of Education will provide the Legislature with data and fiscal analysis under the SFRA. This information may inform the Assembly Budget Committee Hearing of May 5, 2014, as well as the general appropriations discourse leading up to the Fiscal Year 2015 Appropriations Act.

In light of the foregoing, and in the interest of conserving the time and resources of the Court and the parties, the State anticipates no formal filings in opposition to the substantive relief sought by movant ELC in its March 27, 2014, submission to this Court. The Department will act consistent with the Commissioner's testimony.
