

THIS MATTER having opened to the Court on July 24, 2001 by counsel for Plaintiffs E.S. and G.T., on notice to counsel for Defendants, for an Order entering a preliminary injunction compelling Defendants to evaluate the eligibility of Plaintiffs E.S. and G.T. for special education services, to determine Plaintiffs E.S. and G.T. to be eligible for special education services, to develop an Individualized Education Plan ("IEP") for E.S. and G.T. pursuant to the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. §§1400 et seq.

("IDEA"), and related federal and state laws, and to implement an IEP for E.S. and for G.T.; and Defendant Newark Public Schools having evaluated E.S. and G.T. and found them to be eligible for special education and related services under IDEA and related federal and state laws, and having developed an IEP for E.S. and an IEP for G.T. commencing September 2001, and having implemented the IEPs for E.S. and G.T. from September 2001 to the date of this order, and having agreed to continue implementing the IEPs for E.S. and G.T. for the annual period stated in the IEPs; and Plaintiffs having withdrawn their motion for a preliminary injunction because of the actions of Defendant Newark Public Schools as stated in this paragraph; and the Court having considered the arguments of Plaintiffs in support of the motion and the arguments of all Defendants in opposition thereto; and the Court having heard oral argument by all parties on February 5, 2002; and for good cause shown;

IT IS on this 22nd day of February, 2002

ORDERED that Defendants Newark Public Schools, New Jersey Department of Education, William L. Librera, Barbara Gantwerk and Melinda Zangrillo continue to implement an appropriate IEP for E.S. and G.T. for as long as E.S. and G.T. remain eligible for special education services.
