Education Law Center ("ELC") has received information from various reliable sources that large
numbers of students with IEPs throughout the Paterson Public Schools ("PPS") district are not
receiving related services as specified in their IEPs.
Staff and parents from multiple schools throughout the district have reported to ELC that PPS
nas failed to provide related services to numerous students repeatedly during the 2016-17
school year. The problem has existed due to inadequate staffing since at least the beginning of
the 2016-17 school year. Recently, the lack of related services in the district has been severely
exacerbated. ELC has been informed that, due to shortages of its own staff, PPS entered into a

contract with a company called Kid Clan to fulfill various special education needs, including supplying a large number of personnel to provide related services. Estimates have been

provided that 60 Speech Language Specialists, Occupational Therapist, Physical Therapists, and Child Study Team members were serving Paterson students through its Kid Clan contract, starting around November 2016. Many Paterson students, who were not receiving related services at the beginning of the school year, began to receive related services under this contract, although we do not know whether all students with related services in their IEPs were covered by this contract. Unfortunately, the contracted services were temporary. ELC understands that as of early February, 2017, Kid Clan's services to PPS were terminated, and have not been replaced. This has left numerous students without any related services, including speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and counseling.

ELC has received complaints about the district's failure to provide related services from staff and parents at the following schools: Alexander Hamilton Academy (no speech/language services); Dale Avenue School (no speech/language services for ½ students whose IEPs require same, no OT or PT services at all); School 1 (14 students not receiving OT, 2-3 students not receiving PT, 2 students not consistently receiving counseling); School 2 (no speech/language or OT services); School 12 (no speech/language therapist as of February 2017, if not earlier), School 16 (7 students requiring OT, PT, speech/language, and/or counseling had their services stop in February 2017), School 28 (no speech/language therapist), Edward W. Kirkpatrick (no speech/language therapist), Kennedy High School (no speech/language therapist), and Dr. Frank Napier Academy (speech/language vacancy since December 2016, leaving approximately 34 students without services). In almost all cases, those complaining to ELC were aware of similar problems at schools throughout the district. ELC has also been informed by several parents and staff that preschool students throughout the district, both served by community providers and in-district schools, are not receiving related services in accordance with their IEPs. Enclosed is a list of community providers and in-district preschool programs, all of whom serve students with IEPs. ELC's understanding is that many district students with disabilities from preschool through grade 12 are currently not receiving related services required by their IEPs.

ELC requests immediate investigation of this urgent situation, which is likely affecting hundreds, if not thousands, of students with disabilities in PPS. ELC requests investigation of gaps in the provision of related services from September 6, 2016 to the present – including speech therapy, occupational therapy, physical therapy, and counseling – to all PPS students whose IEPs specify provision of such services.

PPS must immediately reinstate provision of related services to all students whose IEPs require them. All related services must be provided in conformance with the IEPs (length of sessions, number of sessions per week or month, individual or group therapy, etc.) and must be provided by personnel with appropriate training and qualifications.

Additionally, PPS must provide compensatory education to all students who the district has failed to provide with related services at any point during the 2016-17 school year. The amount of compensatory education for each student should be equivalent to the related services sessions that were missed by that student.

PPS must be prohibited from using online or telepractice speech therapist services to resolve this problem, except under very limited parameters that must be spelled out by NJDOE, OSEPP. These parameters must include: 1) the requirement that any change in services from direct to online or telepractice be done in accordance with IEP procedures, requiring an IEP team determination that such services will meet an individual child's needs and fully informed consent by the child's parent; and 2) the requirement that any use of online services or telepractice be done in accordance with recognized effective practices within the speech/language profession which restrict such services to: adults; fluency, voice, and articulation; and language cases only where the client is able to focus appropriately.

Please note that because PPS is a State-operated school district, ELC requests the designation of a neutral investigator not employed by the State to handle this complaint. See N.J.A.C. 6A:14-9.2 ("The State Director of the Office of Special Education Programs or designee(s) shall be responsible for reviewing, investigating and taking action on any signed written complaint regarding the provision of special education and related services . . . ." (emphasis added)).

Many parents and district personnel have brought this matter to the district's attention, including to special education director Cheryl Coy, but the problem is ongoing.
